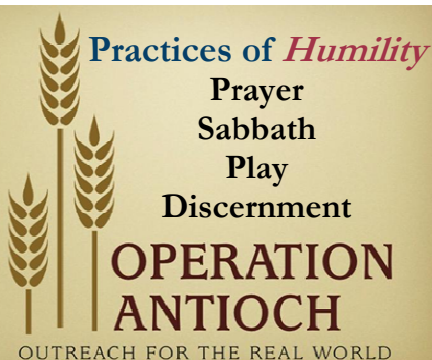

"Prescription for Worry"

We live in an anxious age. People are full of concerns for personal health, the health of a loved one, the world situation, and other matters. We know worry is a problem but what do we do with it? The Bible has much to say about worry and its effects on the body and soul. It also contains very practical help in neutralizing the debilitating effects of worry.

Here is a four point prescription for worry.

First, read and memorize scripture. Some pertinent "worry verses" are Jeremiah 29:11; 1 Peter 5:7; Philippians 4:6, 13, 19; Matthew 6:25, 34; John 14:27, 16:33. There are many others. Keep a list in your Bible, and let God speak to you through His Word.

Second, take time to review your entire life, not just the part you're worried about. We tend to focus almost exclusively on whatever worries us and ignore others areas that are should be of great comfort. If you need any proof of this, notice next time what happens when whatever you worried about is resolved. What happens next? Another worry percolates to the top! Perhaps if we stop looking only at what worries us we will see other ways God is at work. And remember, circumstances can alter our plans, but they never alter God's purpose. Talk to God

about your worry and listen to Him remind you of all His blessings.

Third, laugh. Laughter really is wonderful medicine, and it's not anti-Christian! Ezra and Nehemiah counseled the people to be joyous by reminding them that "the joy of the Lord is your strength." Joy is laughter of the soul. Find a way to give expression to that which God put in your soul.

Fourth, praise is always appropriate. We make a mistake of assuming we can only praise God when we are really happy with the way everything is going. But in the Bible we find the Psalmist praising God from the depths (read Psalm 22) and Paul praising God from prison. Praise is always appropriate. God is unchanging. Singing a hymn is a wonderful way of expressing your praise to God.

Don't accept worry as an unalterable part of your life. God will help you, but you have a part to play also. Oswald Chambers wrote: "Deliberately tell God that you will not fret about that thing."
