“Risky Business”

When's the last time you did something risky? Now, I'm not talking about a small potatoes kind of risk, like playing the lottery or speeding through an intersection with a yellow light. When is the last time you took a big scary risk?

Did you take a chance investing your savings in a business opportunity? Did you ask the girl of your dreams to marry you before you knew she would say yes? Did you go bungee jumping, or sky diving, or cliff jumping?

I have a friend named J.D. whom I admire for his ability to take risks. When I met J.D. he was a professional rodeo cowboy, who made his living on the professional bull riding circuit. Night after night he voluntarily climbed onto the backs of animals larger than the car that I drive – bulls with names like ‘spotted demon’ and ‘sasquatch’ – and attempted to hang on for eight seconds.

J.D. wasn't just a bull rider. He was also a savvy business man. I've seen him start businesses. I've seen him sell businesses. I've seen him take risks in the business world that gave me ulcers. J.D. is a risk taker. He's the kind of guy who's always looking to do something big.

Did you know the Bible is full of risk takers? Abraham was a risk taker. He didn't ride bulls, or invest his savings in a business opportunity, but he followed God to a place he wasn't even sure existed. David was a risk taker. He faced down a Philistine giant with nothing but a pocket full of rocks to defend himself. Esther, Peter, Paul...all risk takers. Each one attempted great things for God because they expected great things from God.

Me? I'm a play it safe kind of guy, but I often wish that I wasn't. I often wonder what life would look like if I attempted something big for God because I expected great things from God. What if I really committed myself to caring for widows and orphans? Or to stop human trafficking? Or to feeding the hungry? What if each one of us attempted great things for God because we expected great things from God?
