"You Are Glorious!"

What degree of glory are you? It's an odd question and most people would shy away from even considering "glory" to be part of their personal descriptions. I don't feel very glorious. In fact, it sounds vain to even say it.

But the Bible, as is often the case, offers a very different perspective from our rather limited one. In 2 Cor. 3:18 Paul wrote "And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being changed into His likeness from one degree of glory to another." I do not have space in this column to explain all the imagery of this verse, but I want to note two points especially.

First, we all are beholding the glory of the Lord. As I was driving to church this morning, the sunrise transformed some clouds into a beautiful display of light. Hues of red, blue, and gold adorned the sky and reminded me of a transcendent beauty I certainly did not see in the surrounding traffic. God has woven His glory throughout creation and never leaves us without reminders that He is near. So, we are beholding the glory of God, and that comes as a surprise to no one reading this column.

Second, we are vessels of God's glory and are growing in

it degree by degree. Most Christians have not given this important truth even a minute of serious consideration, but it is truly life-transforming. God is at work in you and His glory will become clearer and clearer.

Think of glory, in this instance, as a bright light within you. Our external lives are probably quite cluttered and smudged. The Light only peeks through occasionally. But as we embrace God's transforming presence, the clutter diminishes, the lens of our works becomes clearer, and people will give glory to God because of what they have seen in us.

This spiritual luminosity is not an occasion for self-admiration (that would effectively extinguish the Light in you). God's glory through you is cleansing and energizing. Remembering that you were created for this glory should be a powerful reminder for you to let this Light shine through your faith and good works.

So what degree of glory are you? And what degree will you be in the near future? You are glorious!
