## “Day to Day Deep Commitment”

“And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.” Colossians 3:17

“Whatever you do” and “everything” is a high calling. The mistake we typically make in the Christian life is to attempt to elevate “whatever” and “everything” to the realm of “highly Christian acts.” We want everything and whatever to be *awesome* and *miraculous*, and may even be guilty of trying to manufacture that. Thus, I want my sermon to be a tour de force, my column to be insightful and inspiring, my devotional to be so deep as to cause all heaven to pause in wonder. Why? Because “whatever” and “everything” is a call to supernatural excellence!

Trying to live the Christian life that way is eventually going to leave you feeling defeated and frustrated. God did not make you to live every day on the Mount of Transfiguration. He made you to live in the aftermath of events like that. God has a habit of showing us great things, and then asking us to faithfully guard the memory of those events without expecting a daily duplication of the earth shattering miracle. Thus Israel remembered God’s deliverance from Egypt while they walked in the wilderness for forty years.
