To be quite honest, the praying and listening parts are the easiest. It’s in the “being” where we have difficulties. The expressions of love, grace, peace, and justice are the desires of God and the examples of Christ.

Mary Fraser writes, “What would grace unshackled from its exile in categories of rescue look like? I think it would look like mercy running wild across the planet. I think it would look like rivers of forgiveness. Grace would look like Mom and Dad weeping over the casket of their beloved son, and little girls setting off balloons for the mother they lost. Grace would look like the people who wrap their arms around the hurting to hold the experience of being alive in solidarity.”

May the Lord whose nature is love and whose path is justice help us to embody right relationships in all our undertakings.
