"The Key to the Book of Revelation"

I really shouldn't be telling you this. Countless charlatans have made countless piles of cash selling their charts and graphs and predictions. I'm taking away a whole industry, throwing countless people out of work. But I have to break the silence. The major theme of Book of Revelation may be the easiest in the New Testament to understand. And it applies to you. Today.

We find clues sprinkled throughout the book. We find the repeated words, "patient endurance" in several places (e.g. 1:9, 2:2, 2:19). We find the phrase, "you have not grown weary, (2:3) and the exhortation to "be faithful" and "hold fast" (2:13). "You have kept my word of patient endurance" is in 3:10.

All of these exhortations are in the first section of the book where Jesus was reviewing each of the seven churches. He either admired or encouraged their endurance.

The most confusing part of Revelation begins in chapter 4. Here is where we encounter strange beasts, numberless angels, wild colors, and various plagues. Frankly all of this is a playground for crackpots. History is replete with quacks ready to put their stamp on an

interpretation and sell it to us for \$14.95 (workbook extra). No wonder people throw up their hands in despair when it comes to the book of Revelation.

But God put no book in the Bible to frustrate and confuse us. He is a God of clarity and revelation. Any time we run into interpretive difficulties we can be certain the problem is on our side. So it is with the book of Revelation.

So what is the message? "Here is a call for the endurance of the saints" (13:10, 14:12). Right in the middle of 10 horned beasts rising up from the sea and everyone getting the mark of the beast is a simple reminder: stand strong with God.

That's the message you need today even though you're not dealing with dragons and scorpions. No matter how unimaginably bad the world gets the King is still in residence and His flag is still flying. You are His child and He will never forsake you. Now you can handle Monday. And the rest of the week.

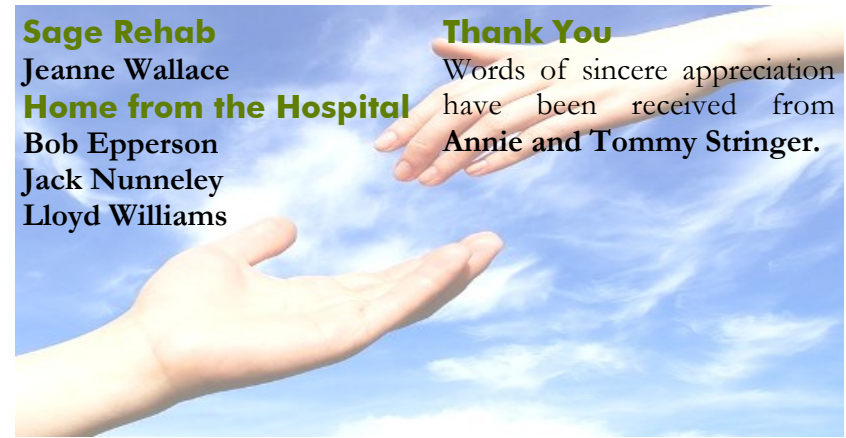
