“Maundy Thursday”

In 1922, Emily Post published her treatise on manners and entertaining entitled *Etiquette in Society, in Business, in Politics, and at Home*. It's not a book that I own, but I could probably use a copy. Of the many books of etiquette produced in the last hundred years, hers is possibly the most popular. Through her book, she taught many of us how to sit at the dinner table, how to write a letter, and even how to eat our food.

Now, I'm not sure if it was Ms. Post who said it, but I've always been told that there are three topics that should not be talked about in polite company: politics, money, and religion. I do my very best to follow that advice, but this is an election year, so politics is unavoidable, especially for those of us with facebook and twitter accounts.

During most election cycles there is a heavy tension in the air, but it is unusually heavy this year; you can almost see the anger. The internet is filled with hateful memes and ugly attacks, false accusations and misrepresentations. Television and news media aren't much better.

Some of us are observers of the ugliness; some of us are participants. Either way many of us are angry, or sad, or fearful; most of us recognize that it's a problem.

The celebration of

Maundy Thursday may be the solution for many of us. Maundy Thursday is a holiday that doesn't get much press, but it's pretty important. It gets its name from the Latin word *mandatum*, which means commandment. It has this name because on this day we celebrate the love commandment of Jesus.

According to John's gospel, Jesus spent His last night before His crucifixion having dinner with His disciples. During this Thursday evening meal, Jesus offered His last words to His disciples, which I imagine were the ones He felt were the most important for them to hear. Of all the things He could have talked with them about, He chose to talk to them about love. He told them that they should love each other; He commanded them to love each other with the same self-sacrificial love that He offered them (John 13:34).

This Thursday, March 24th, beginning at 6 p.m. we will be hosting a Maundy Thursday celebration at Broadmoor. We'll gather together in the gym and share a meal together, we'll share Lord's Supper together, and we'll pray together. We'll have the opportunity to set aside whatever causes us anger, or sadness, or fear and choose to love instead. We'll have the opportunity to show the world that we are followers of Jesus by loving one another. I hope to see you there. *-Dave*
