"A Settled Mind"

"Thou dost Keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on Thee, because he trusts in Thee. Trust in the Lord forever, for the Lord God is an everlasting rock." (Isaiah 26:3)

All the prophets combine warning and hope. Isaiah is no exception. The "Isaiah Apocalypse" is four chapters (24-27) and is full of very bad news. God gave Isaiah the foresight to see the approaching Assyrian armies and describe in graphic detail the destruction that terrible force would bring to the land and people. That's the warning.

But in typical Isaiah fashion, he also included the theme of hope. Even during the apocalyptic events a faithful person could find peace in God.

Trouble does not necessarily, or even usually, obscure God's work in our lives. Often it magnifies it. An apocalyptic event (the trouble we encounter) can actually distill our thinking. Against the backdrop of trouble, we tend to see God's goodness more clearly.

Someone has said that the mind is like Velcro, whatever you throw at it tends to stick. Isaiah would not have understood the analogy, but he did understand the principle. Our

greatest challenge is to have our minds "stayed" on God. This means that we have settled the issue as to what is most important. We will keep God at the forefront of our thoughts throughout the day. When disturbed, we see the problem in us (a lack of trust) and pray for God's assurance. We look at all of life through the lens of God's providence and trust Him no matter what.

God's promise for this discipline is truly wonderful: He will keep you in perfect peace. God is the solution to all your troubles. When you try to take over a problem and solve it on your own, you are attempting a task that only God can accomplish. Attempt nothing without having a mind settled on God.

Whatever the nature of your "personal apocalypse" this week, you can experience God's perfect peace. God has provided what you need. Simply pray for the strength to trust Him. He will give it.
