



“Too Young?”

This Sunday is Senior Sunday, when we honor graduating high school seniors. We will recognize them because the church recognizes transitions: births, marriages, funerals, and such. Graduations, too, are a major life transition. We in the church are even affected by graduations, because transitions change the dynamics of our youth ministry and congregation. And, as exciting as they are, graduations may even feel like grief. As a youth minister, graduations were exciting for me; but that transition also meant the loss of young friends I had journeyed with five, six, seven years to camps, snow skiing, mission trips, and shared Bible study with. Nevertheless, today I enjoy celebrating their career achievements and their growing families. So our church must recognize this transition, to honor those who are growing out of homes and church and to encourage them to keep growing up in Christ.

Senior Sunday is also special because we get to be led in worship by our youth. I heard a saying, “To be old and wise you must first be young and stupid,” and was reminded how easy it is to discount God’s leaders because of age or other features society uses to disqualify them from being taken seriously. Jeremiah believed what grown-ups said about him: “Alas, Sovereign LORD, I do not

know how to speak; I am too young.” (1:6). That is, no one will take me seriously. God’s reply: “Do not say, ‘I am too young.’ You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you. ⁸Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you.” God never said, “Oh, you are right! You are young. I didn’t think of that.” (1:7-8) Whatever we might think, may we never discount those whom God has ordained, young or old. May we support in prayer and with words those who said yes when called to serve this Sunday.

And finally, I am excited because our guest preacher is a graduating college senior: Mary Mullen. This will be Mary’s second sermon at BBC. Mary has been serving this semester as Intern with BBC and Interfaith Federation of Baton Rouge. In addition to preparing a sermon and preaching, Mary led a four-week Wednesday night Bible study, and is working with the Mission Committee on our mission project in Lake Providence, and as a partner with Broadmoor High School. We will receive a love offering on May 12 for Mary’s work among us this semester and pray God’s blessing on her transition to work and college.
