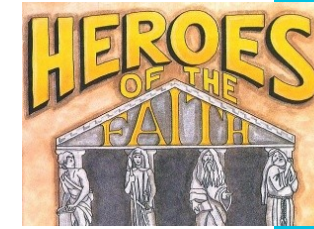

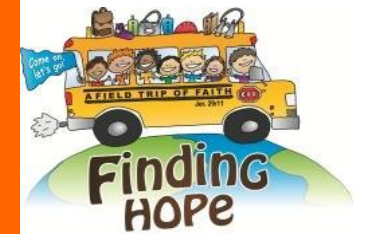

"Beyonce Is no Substitute for God"

Three books highlight our greatest spiritual challenge today. The first book is Aldous Huxley's Brave New World (1932). Huxley describes a culture that has fallen in love with technology and is completely controlled by it. A benevolent world government genetically engineers every person and trains, drugs, and seduces them into a contented existence that has no disease, war, anxiety, but also only nothing but shallow interests, limited capacity or desire to think, souls without love and longing. They exist but don't really live.

Let's move ahead to 1986. Neil Postman wrote a book entitled Amusing Ourselves to Death. Postman believed we had reached the Brave New World in many ways. He said that technology and entertainment had become the supreme desire for most people. We want to be entertained and we want to have access to tremendous amounts of information. The overload this has produced is a lost capacity to discern truth. We have decided that there really is no such thing as truth and so we turn instead to entertainment. The entertainment must become more and more sophisticated and explosive (literally). We want to be entertained and we

want to be entertaining. Postman said these developments have created a huge shift in values.

The final book is Richard Winter's Still Bored in a Culture of Entertainment (2003). His main thesis is that the abundance of technology and exciting entertainment has produced a deadness of the soul. Much of our technology is socially isolating. I mean that when we are staring at a television or a computer screen we are not interacting with one another and we are losing that capacity to really talk to one another. The increasingly explosive entertainment options we have produce an overstimulation that leads to boredom that insulates people from God.

Psalm 42 is for every seeker. "As a hart longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for thee, O God. My soul thirst for the living God. When shall I come and behold the face of God?" That is our deepest need. Beyonce is no substitute for God. Abide in Christ. Carve out time from your busy schedule to pray to Him and reflect on His truth and beauty.
