“Do This in Remembrance of Me”

This Sunday morning we will gather in worship to remember. Paul called this gathering the *Lord's Supper* (1 Cor. 11), invoking memories of the last meal Jesus had with His apostles. And like the apostles we will gather clothed with questions and struggles, clothed with some understanding and a significant lack of understanding, clothed in both faithfulness and faithlessness. We will gather to remember because we possess much; yet we lack much and remain a needy lot. We will gather to remember because our emptiness often comes from our abundance. We will gather to remember because of our need to receive that which we do not have and release that which we do have. We will gather to remember because we need Jesus - in ways we seem incapable of understanding or explaining.

Often we refer to this remembrance in worship as *Communion*. *Communion* reflects the relational aspect of this moment of remembrance. In the upper room where the Last Supper took place the apostles had a most profound experience with Jesus. As we remember we will trust that we can encounter the presence of the crucified and risen Christ in a profound way, at a profound level that quenches our deepest spiritual hunger and thirst. And since encountering Jesus Christ is to encounter the Divine, often we

say *Holy Communion*.

The *Lord's Supper* is also referred to as the *Eucharist*. *Eucharist* refers to an expression of gratitude or thanksgiving. The evangelists in the synoptic gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke) and Paul in 1 Corinthians highlighted Jesus giving thanks when he was sharing the last meal with his apostles. So as we remember we hope to express gratitude. Of Christ followers remembering Jesus in the Lord's Supper - Frederick Buechner wrote, “On their part Christians have nothing for which to be more grateful.”

Obviously as part of worship this Sunday we will be encouraged to prepare to partake and participate in this Holy Remembering. However we do not need to wait. Start now. Buechner made a suggestion that if implemented may help us to prepare for this *Holy Communion*, this *Eucharist*, this blessed remembering.

The next time you walk down the street, take a good look at every face you pass and in your mind say Christ died for thee. That girl. That slob. That phony. That crook. That saint. That fool. Christ died for thee. Take and eat this in remembrance that Christ died for thee. (Wishful Thinking: A Theological ABC)

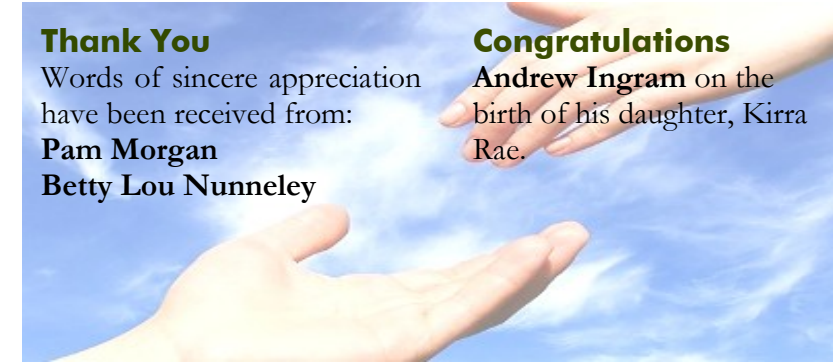
