## "School Is In Session"

School days have returned. Our children (or young adults) start a new semester, and all parents are dealing with the annual array of expenses, hectic schedules, and all the pleasantness of car pool lines. This annual autumn ritual led me to a few thoughts on the school days of a Christian.

First, our school days are never over. We don't graduate or even have a summer off. Each day is new and presents countless opportunities to either learn or apply the lessons we have learned in the past. We need to cultivate and guard this seamless transition between learning and life. Faith AND practice is the way theologians write about this idea. What we do on Sunday really does need to make a difference in the way we live on Monday and throughout the remainder of the week.

Second, we can learn a great many lessons from good examples. We're surrounded by them. One reason we should read scripture daily is to learn good lessons from good examples. I regularly recommend Christians read the Sermon on the Mount because Jesus is the best good example we have. In fact, I'll make that your assignment for the new school year. In case you've forgotten,

the Sermon on the Mount is Matthew 5-7. It is the largest single block of Jesus' teaching we find in the Bible. You have probably read every word, but I assure you the Spirit will bring something new to mind. One of His tasks is to remind us of Jesus' teaching (John 14:25-26). Give the Spirit more of an opportunity to teach you by reading the Bible.

Third, we can learn from bad examples. To stick with the Bible, we have a lot of bad examples in those pages. David thrills us with his psalms but also chills us with his sins. He's a warning to us. The real key is to not become a bad example. We don't have to touch the stove. We're all old enough to learn about dangers without repeating them.

So, whatever your age, it's time to go to school.
