"Anger"

Anger. It even sounds like a dangerous word. It has a "grrrr" at the end of it. The very word growls at you.

The Scripture has quite a bit of warning concerning anger. James 1:19 states "let a man be quick to hear, slow to speak, and slow to anger." Jesus even equated anger with the seeds of murder (Matt. 5:22). Discerning what is inside of us is difficult, but if anger is there then you don't really know what you're capable of doing. So clearly anger is highly combustible and almost always negative.

First, it is highly incapable of producing positive results. Now I know when I was a child I feared my father in a wholly responsible way. I was not afraid of him, but I was afraid of his wrath. I knew when I transgressed, and I knew the ominous meaning of my mother's words "wait until your father gets home."

But I have long passed those early fears when I grew up. They were replaced by a genuine conviction about right and wrong, a deep desire to justify my father's faith in me. Fear produces an obedience of limited depth. Encouragement, wisdom, example; these produce maturity that honors God.

Second, almost everyone can justify their own anger. They usually call it self-righteous indignation. Ironically, that's precisely what it is. Self-righteous. Can you show me anywhere in the Bible where we are encouraged to have self-righteous anything? Self-righteous angry people love to point to Jesus' clearing out the temple, and claim affinity to Him.

May I point out one important difference? He was the Son of God. You're not.

Third, anger, and its first cousins hatred and fear, are the most corrosive emotions you can have. They take up so much energy to maintain and draw away from every other high impulse that could make you more Christ-like.

I do understand when someone tells me that they feel as if they can't help being angry, but part of your spiritual maturity is resisting that dangerous and easy response. We need desperately the wise counsel of a trusted Christian friend to help us find a way out of this terrible mess. Read scripture, pray, and look for someone God will send you this week.
