In 1930 Dr. Hugh Kerr, minister of Shadyside Presbyterian Church, proposed an idea at his denomination’s annual General Assembly intended to illustrate how each Christian congregation was interconnected with one another. The idea was simple. Once a year churches from all sorts of traditions would celebrate communion and focus their attention on Christian unity and ecumenical cooperation. That idea began to take hold and by 1940 World Communion Sunday, as it would be called, was promoted to Christian churches worldwide.

World Communion Sunday is an idea that has become a tradition; it is a tradition that has become an important part of our worship at Broadmoor. Each year, on the first Sunday in October, we celebrate the Lord’s Supper and we recognize that we are interconnected with Christian churches around the globe, across our country, and in our home town. It is an opportunity for us to recognize and take seriously Paul’s vision of the church: we are all part of one body, we each have a function, and we can’t do without each other (1 Co-

rinthians 12:12-27).

Observing World Communion Sunday is one small step towards cooperation and partnership. It is one small step towards unity. It is one small step towards recognizing that every Christian congregation is interconnected and interdependent.

We’ve had a rough summer in Baton Rouge. One of the best gifts we can give to our bruised and fractured city is a church that recognizes it is one part of a larger whole; a church that actively seeks cooperation and partnership. We can give our city the gift of a church that joins together with other churches to seek the welfare of the city.

Observing World Communion Sunday is not a solution, but it is a step in the right direction. Join us this Sunday as we observe World Communion Sunday and celebrate our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the globe, across our country, and in our home town.
