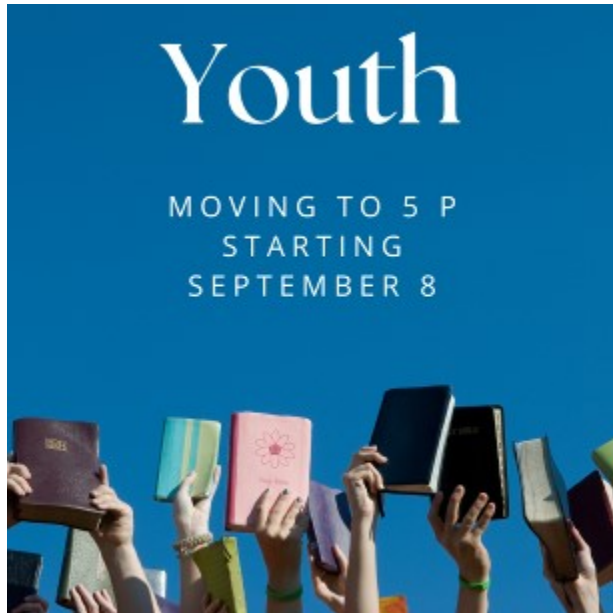

## “What’s With All the Blood? ”

I may be a bit biased, but I love our Bible study classes at BBC. It may have something to do with the fact that I get to choose the topics, albeit with some input from our membership. I love to learn, and I am continually learning. If you ever think you have heard it all before, you haven’t been part of our weekly Bible studies; and I want to invite you to join us for one or all of them! In our Bible and the Quran video series, our New Testament teacher raises a very interesting observation from the Gospel According to Luke. Keep in mind that Luke also wrote the book of Acts, which follows his Gospel quite neatly.

In chapter 22 of his Gospel, most Bibles have the traditional Lord’s Supper “words of institution”: “This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.”<sup>20</sup> And he did the same with the cup after supper, saying, “This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.” We read this passage without blinking an eye, but the truth is, Luke 22:19b-20 is not in our earliest and best manuscripts. That is, a scribe inserted that line later, as he was either bothered by the fact that Luke didn’t include it, or thought Luke must have forgotten it.

Actually, neither of those. In all of the Gospel of Luke and the book of Acts, Luke, who follows Mark for a great deal of his Gospel, does not include

what we call “Atonement” passages that Matthew, Mark, and Paul include in their theologies. We know this because it is obvious. When Luke is following Mark word-for-word, he leaves out “Atonement” passages. Luke apparently doesn’t believe in it. Luke has more of a “Forgiveness” theology. Here’s the difference: atonement is like owing a debt, say a loan, and someone comes along and says, “You can make payments.” Or they say, “If you can’t pay it, get someone who can.” That is, atonement is simply debt restructured. Forgiveness, though, is when the person owed a debt says, “You know what, just forget about it. You don’t owe me anything.” That’s Luke.

Maybe you’ve always had a problem with requiring the sacrifice of animals or people, the requirement of blood in order to make things right. As our teacher puts it, your daughter makes a mistake, so you can only forgive her if you kill her cat – that atonement. Never fear! Luke has us “forgiveness” types in mind, too. Wouldn’t it be amazing to believe that God has the power to forgive without requiring death, blood, and sacrifice. Looks like there is something for both kinds in our Bible. Yes, Jesus paid it all. Also, yes, Jesus forgives you for free. Amen.
