As our Wednesday Bible Study, *Introduction to the Hebrew Bible* wraps up this month, I want to invite you to consider one (or more) of our newest Bible Studies on the horizon. One was requested by several members; another was offered, but, for some, was hindered by the time-change last fall; and a third was of personal interest, offered in hopes that it may be of interest to you, as well. Descriptions and details below.

HOW THE BIBLE WAS MADE - This requested study will show how the Bible did not simply "fall from the sky," but how the New Testament and Hebrew Bible evolved in parallel, often in conversation with each other, ensuring a continuing mutual influence of Jewish and Christian traditions. It will explain how the books that were chosen into our canon came to be, along with when, where, and by whom they were written, and most importantly, why. August 8-Conference Room.

HEAVEN, HELL, AND THE DEVIL: A HISTORY OF THE AFTERLIFE – This study is a new kick-off of the Sunday night study that began last fall. The time-change prevented those whose driving is hampered by the dark. This new, day-time study will start from the beginning, unveiling the origins of the concepts of

Heaven, Hell, and the Devil – an historical approach at appreciating the evolution of beliefs from no afterlife, to a place for all dead, to the resurrection of the body, to the resurrection of the soul/spirit, as well as the gatekeepers of the afterlife. Begins August 7, 10-11am in Church Conference Room.

THE BIBLE AND THE

QURAN - This study will discuss textual, literary, and historical problems connected with the Bible and the Quran, led by scholars in New Testament and Islam, dealing with the same challenges of both. Each session consists of eight 45-50-minute video lectures, alternating between Christianity and Islam, exploring the Bible and the Quran using the latest historical scholarship. Four topics will be addressed: getting back to the originals, the reliability of the accounts, the quests for the historical Iesus and the historical Muhammad, and scripture and violence (are scriptures to blame for hatred and violence?). Coming in late May or early June.

MUSIC NOTES from Lori

For this week's Newsletter, I thought you might enjoy a brief commentary on some of the music we heard in worship this past Sunday. As a reminder, the "scriptural focus" was on the Ecclesiastes text "To everything there is a season." You may have been surprised when, during 'Pre-Service Music,' our own Average Church Band presented the Pete Seeger song version of this text, which was made famous back in 1965 by the rock band The Byrds. While the words to this song are biblical, the initial intent of this song was not specifically "for use in church." However, throughout the history of American music, the influence of the Christian church has been well documented and apparent. The Byrds was one of several rock bands who worked less overtly in the Christian music genre but, over the years, recorded several Christian-faith songs. John Seetoo writes in his article SONGS OF PRAISE FROM UNLIKELY ARTISTS, that "...throughout the band's 1964-1973 lifespan, The Byrds repeatedly released songs of Christian faith." Turn! Turn! Turn!' followed the release of the band's big hit "Mr. Tambourine Man" and later, other faith-based songs (Biblical or Christian texts/thought) followed (e.g. "I Like the Christian Life" and "Jesus Is Just Alright"). Many members of the band turned to Christianity later on in life and remained active as solo artists. One example is Chris Hillman, bassist for and co-founder of The Byrds, whose poignant phrase in the song "I'm Still Alive" is "I will go on forever, and forever I'll be in God's grace through all eternity." I believe there are many ways and musical styles in which one can express the words of Christian belief and I hope you found a way to connect emotionally and spiritually through the experience we all shared together.
