“Did You Know? Part 2”

Did you know the Apostle Paul never directly called Jesus, “God?” Actually, we don’t know if he *never* did. Just not in his letters that we have. Let’s say that, if Paul had a ministry of thirty years, and let’s say that he started twenty churches and wrote two letters to each church for thirty years, then he would have written 1200 letters! And we have only *seven* of those letters – at least the seven that are actually his. Six letters either claim to have been, or tradition has led us to believe were, written by Paul, that scholars have good reason to think he did not.

Obviously, we don’t have all the letters Paul wrote to his churches, so we don’t know if he ever directly called Jesus, “God.” Furthermore, what we have from him are not “gospels,” so we don’t know how much Paul knew about Jesus. He wrote some letters earlier than gospels were written. And, by the way, did you know the Apostle Paul almost never quotes Jesus or writes about what Jesus said? He quotes Jesus only three times, and all from the same letter (Corinthians): pay your preacher, it’s better not to get divorced, and the words of the last supper.

To answer the original question, of the letters we believe are Paul’s, the only occa-

sion where Paul may have directly called Jesus, “God” is: 1 Timothy 3:16. The Greek word at issue begins with either an omicron or a theta. Both are circles, but theta has a horizontal line running through it. The oldest manuscript appears to have a theta; all others have omicron. The significance of that little line is that, if the letter is a theta, the word is “God.” If the letter is an omicron, the word is “who.” You see?

An 18th century scholar analyzing the oldest manuscript, with a “line” in the “circle,” the theta, discovered that the line had bled through from the words written on the back of the page. That is, the original word was “who” and not “God.” Check your Bible translation of 1 Timothy 3:16 and see which interpretation your version chose. A scribal error, inadvertent mark, scribe intentionally changing the meaning, or ink bleeding through the papyrus can make a tremendous difference in interpretation. “Let’s eat, grandma.” “Let’s eat grandma!”

Next “Did You Know?” we’ll look at a popular passage in John that was not in the earliest manuscripts of the Bible and ask, “Should we leave it in?”
