Seeds of faith "Reaping What We Sow" Galatians 6:8 Stewardship 2026

The concept of planting what you want is so simple and ful. natural that Jesus readily grabbed it for his life-lessons. He wanted us to have eyes to see extraordinary in the ordinary stuff of life. Farming was no longer just about growing food; it was about growing a kingdom. Seeds weren't merely packets with the potential to feed, but packets with the potential to save. Not unlike his instruction to take our eyes off him and notice ... birds and flowers. These, too, are loaded with lessons. Ordinary things that have something to do with God's purpose for us.

ordinary stuff, we have done the same for our Stewardship theme. It is quite simple: plant what you want. On the level of farming food, it means that, if you want watermelon, then plant watermelon seeds. If you want petunias, then plant petunia seeds. On another level, if you want to be good at business, then plant seeds that grow the skill of business. Or if you want to be good at languages, then plant seeds that grow the skill of languages. On another level, it may mean that, if you want to be wise, then plant seeds of wisdom. Or, if you want to be patient, then plant We know how that turns out for seeds that grow patience. Here's one: if you want to be remembered for generosity, then plant seeds that make you generous. If you want to be faithful, then

plant seeds that make you faith-

We know what it looks like to plant literal food and flower seeds. But what does it look like to plant "faithfulness" seeds? It depends on what you think "faithfulness" looks like. If faithfulness looks like showing up when you are needed, then planting "faithfulness" seeds looks like ... showing up. If generosity looks like sharing your time or gifts or money, then planting generosity seeds looks like giving. It is really quite simple and natural.

Plant what you want. That is, plant what you want to grow. Because Jesus elevated What do you want to grow at church? When you know what that is, then you – not someone else - you plant what you want to grow. Plant it, water it, nurture it - tend to it. Sometimes we hear people say, "I wish we could do ..." or "I wish we had a more ..." What? One thing is certain, if we don't plant it, we won't get it. That is all we're asking for this Stewardship Season: Plant What You Want. Like the parable of the talents, Jesus would prefer we "plant," or risk the "talents" (word for money), and trust it to the soil/God, rather than conserve it and protect it. the one who hides it, instead. God can make good farmers of us all!
